**Sub: Request for implementing the tax system already promised by union Govt. of India.**

Sir,

VALUE ADDED TAX System was implemented on the ground of being transparent, uniform, revenue oriented as well as to reduce burden of input tax liability. To meet the objectives envisaged in the system Central Sales Tax was declared to be phased out in three years. But the last leg of the "Phase" has halted. Due to the applicability of Central Sales Tax, Purchaser prefers to import material from outside the state by paying 2% Central Sales Tax rather than purchasing it from local manufacturers where VAT rates are 12.5%. Thus manufacturers are deprived of the legitimate share in their own state. This state of affairs can not be undone except with the abolition of Central Sales Tax.

Therefore in order to do justice for the growth & Prosperity of all States it is inevitable that:-

1. Central Sales Tax may kindly be abolished at the earliest.
2. Or for time being facility of central declaration & Concessional forms under Central Sales Tax rules be withdrawn.

**Sub: - Request for forwarding our representation to union Finance Minister New Delhi.**

Sir,

You are aware that when VAT System was recommended by the Central Govt. and subsequently implemented by the States, it was decided that Central Sales Tax will be abolished in a phased manner. Though beginning was made yet the last leg of phase out has been halted and 2% Central Sales Tax is still applicable.

Due to the continuation of Central Sales Tax, purchasers including Govt. departments prefer to import material from outside the State. This situation on one hand affects the revenue of the state adversely and on other manufacturers within the State are losing bussiness to their counterparts outside the state.

We have represented to Hon'ble Finance Minister Govt. of India as under in this regard:-

3. Central Sales Tax may kindly be abolished at the earliest.
4. Or for time being facility of central declaration& Concessional forms under Central Sales Tax rules be withdrawn.

Copy of the letter sent to Hon'ble Finance Minister is enclosed herewith for ready reference.

We are approaching you with the request that in the interest of revenue of the State, you may also recommend the above action to be taken by Finance Minister, Govt. of India.

Looking forward for a favourable action in the matter.
